

2021-2022 Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

Air Quality

• The Academy continues to make upgrades to our HVAC systems to improve indoor air quality: including maintaining, replacing, and upgrading systems.

Cleaning

- Increased cleaning of frequently touched surfaces and maintenance protocols that include:
 - Hand Sanitizer Stations
 - Endura Antimicrobial Coatings
 - i Wave Air Purifiers
- Hands-on classrooms will undergo cleaning after every class period with an EPA-approved disinfectant.

Health Screening Students and Staff

- Parents/guardians should conduct a daily student <u>wellness check</u> prior to sending student(s) to school.
- Staff will be required to conduct daily self-examinations, including a temperature check. Documentation will be submitted using MI Symptoms.

Hygiene

- Adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors will be provided (including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for safe use by staff and students, paper towels, tissues, and signs reinforcing proper handwashing techniques).
- Handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and/or the safe use of hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol will be taught and reinforced.

Instruction

- The Academy will provide in-person instruction.
- The Academy will provide educational support for students and families who are impacted by isolation and quarantine by utilizing Schoology, a learning management system (LMS), where everything (grades, attendance, resources, etc.) is available on one platform.

• The Academy will provide educational technology for students and staff to improve instruction and implementation of the curriculum.

Staffing

- The Academy will hire new staff to reduce class sizes to allow for social distancing.
- The Academy will provide retention bonuses to existing highly-qualified staff members to maintain high-quality instruction and continuity of services.

Social-Emotional Learning

- The Academy will provide social-emotional support for student's and families needs through evidence-based curriculum and professional development.
- All students and staff will have access to two, on-site, professional mental health counselors.

Isolation and Quarantine

- The Academy will work with the HDNWM to support case investigation and the contact tracing process.
- Isolation and quarantine will adhere to local public health requirements and operating procedures.
- Close contact is defined as individuals who were within 3 feet of an infected individual for more than 15 minutes if both the infected individual and the exposed individual were correctly wearing masks or individuals who were within 6 feet of an infected individual for more than 15 minutes if both the infected individual and the exposed individual were not wearing masks.
- Individuals who are fully vaccinated do not need to quarantine after contact with someone who had COVID unless they have symptoms.
- Individuals who are not vaccinated will need to be quarantined for 10 days after contact with someone who had COVID unless they had a confirmed positive case of COVID within 3 months (and show no symptoms).

Masks

• All staff and DK-12 students will be required to wear masks indoors, regardless of vaccination status, at all times except for mealtime, recess, and/or mask breaks until the public health order has expired.

Social Distancing

• Social distancing measures will continue, to the greatest extent feasible.

Testing

• COVID testing of students or staff will not be required unless mandated by a local or state agency and/or a sanctioning body.

Vaccinations

• The CDC recommends vaccinations to help stop the spread of COVID-19.

Visitors

• Access to the building will not be permitted.

- Every student's academic and social-emotional needs will be addressed through the implementation of evidence-based interventions.
